Millions of children are not getting enough vitamin A, impacting their ability to see clearly, fight off disease, and live a healthy life.




More than 1.7 million people are at risk for lymphatic filariasis or trachoma, which can cause blindness. disfigurement, cognitive issues, and social stigma.

- ✓ Reached more than 6.2 million children under the age of five with two doses of vitamin A, protecting their vision and health.
- Helped reach 1.2 million people with treatment for at least one neglected tropical disease, greatly contributing to the national efforts toward their control and elimination.
- Supported 800 women with training and resources on climate-smart agriculture so they could provide healthy foods to improve household nutrition and generate surplus income.
